## 2021 PAGE Legislative Priorities

- Foster personalized instruction
- Promote student and educator mental health
- Invest in Georgia's public school students and their future
- Institute transparency for student and educator health

# Governor Kemp's Teacher Pipeline Package

- SB 88 sponsored by Sen. Russ Goodman (R-Clinch Co)
- Makes the GA Teacher of the Year an advisory ex officio member of the SBOE
- Prioritizes military veterans to become certified teachers
- Directs GA colleges of teacher education to enhance teacher preparation in differentiated instruction and reading fundamentals
- Articulates the need for more Georgia teachers of color and partnerships with HBCU's
- Directs school districts to focus evaluation resources on new and struggling teachers

# Governor Kemp's Teacher Pipeline Package

- HB 385, by Rep. Shaw Blackmon (R-Bonaire)
- Return to Work Legislation
- Would allow retired teachers in high needs areas to return to work at 100% while drawing TRS benefits
- Participants would need to wait 12 months before becoming eligible
- High needs areas would be determined by RESAs, based on local need
- As a fiscal retirement bill, HB 385 requires a two-year legislative process, and could not become effective until 2022

# Tax Credit for Teachers New to Rural & Low Performing Schools

- HB 32 by Rep. Dave Belton (R-Buckhead)
- Creates a \$3,000 tax credit for teachers who work for specified rural or low-performing schools.
- Credit would be awarded to veteran and new teachers working for schools identified by GaDOE.

## Dexter Mosely ("Tim Tebow") Act

- SB 51 by Rep. Bruce Thompson (R-White)
- Would allow home schooled students to participate in extracurricular activities in their resident public school system
- Student must enroll in one course in their local public school

## Transgender Student Athletes

- HB 276 by Rep. Phillip Singleton (R-Sharpsburg)
- Would make it unlawful for public or private schools, both K-12 and postsecondary, whose students compete against public schools, to allow transgender female athletes to participate in athletic programs designated for females.
- Title IX and other legal issues may apply. Bill has not passed subcommittee.

#### Paid Parental Leave for Educators

- HB 146 by Rep. Houston Gaines (R-Athens)
- Provides three weeks of paid parental leave to eligible state employees in Georgia, including K-12 educators
- Applies after birth of a child, adoption of a child, or placement of a child in foster care
- No state funding attached

## Private School Voucher Legislation

- HB 60 by Wes Cantrell (R-Woodstock)
- Would create publicly funded, parent—controlled student accounts to be used for eligible education expenses, including private school tuition
- Open to students whose districts didn't provide 100% F2F instruction in the prior year, students adopted from foster care, those who have been bullied, special education students, and children of active duty military
- Would create Georgia's third private school voucher program

## Private School Voucher Legislation

- SB 47 by Sen. Steve Gooch (R-Dahlonega)
- Would expand Georgia's existing special education private school voucher program
- Students with IEP's and 504 plans would now be eligible
- Though legal entitlement to special services triggers eligibility, students accepted the voucher waive their legal rights to special services at private schools




# K-12 Funding Highlights

# **QBE Austerity Cuts**




# State Funding for K-12



# Student Mental Health Funding Gaps

- QBE does not fund counselors for 6 student categories: 5 special education and gifted
- QBE-funded counselor-student ratio: 1 per 450 students
- Recommended school counselor-student ratio: 1 per 250 students

# Climbing Student Transportation Costs




## Outdated Funding for Substitutes

- QBE funding for substitutes: \$150 for 8 days per teacher = \$18.75 per day
- Inflation-adjusted QBE funding for substitutes: \$356
   for 8 days per teacher = \$45 per day

  - No accountability for poorly-performing schools
  - **○Big price tag**
